## NOTICE OF MUNICIPAL OFFICES



The Heber City Municipal General Election will be held November 7, 2017 for the following positions: Mayor and 2 City Council Members - 4-year term each. **Candidate filing period is June 1, 2017 through June 7, 2017.**

Declaration of Candidacy forms or Nomination Petitions must be filed in person with the City Recorder at 75 North Main, Heber City, Utah, during the normal business hours of 7:30 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. **The City Recorder's office will be open on Friday, June 2, 2017 8:00-5:00 p.m.** In accordance with Heber City Code, individuals filing as candidates for the Heber City Mayor or Council shall pay a \$50.00 fee at the time of filing their candidacy with the City Recorder. This filing fee shall be refundable only if it is determined that the person filing is not qualified to be a candidate, or who is found to have improperly filed. (Ord. 2003-25, 2003).

## MAIN STREET UPDATE

On May 18, 2017, I had the opportunity to spend the afternoon with the Utah Transportation Commission. The commissioners are the men and women who make the final decisions regarding which projects UDOT will fund for the state. I was given the opportunity to express Heber City's concerns with the traffic problem that Hwy 40 poses on Main Street. The studies have shown that within 4 years, the traffic flow on Main Street could fail. I expressed the City's concern with this and asked for their help in solving the issue on Main Street before the system fails. Currently, UDOT does not have Main Street or the western by-pass road on their list of projects to fund in the next 7 years. I am hoping that after the three-hour bus ride with them around the valley and down Main Street, the UDOT commissioners were able to see why they need to move this project into their immediate projects to fund. As Mayor, one of my main concerns is the traffic problem on Main Street, and I will continue to work with UDOT and Region 3 to create a solution.

On Memorial Day, I hope you had the opportunity to relax with your family and enjoy an outdoor BBQ. Many took a little trip to the cemetery and saw how beautifully it was decorated with flowers and flags, reminding us of the price paid by our military service members and their families. Those who serve under the Stars and Stripes embody the highest form of citizenship. May we always remember to show respect to those that have stepped into harm's way to protect our freedoms and safeguard the ideals that we as a Nation cherish.
