All dogs in Wasatch County aged four months and older must be licensed. All annual dog licenses expire December 31st and must be renewed each January. Dog licenses may be obtained at the City Treasurer's Office, 75 North Main Street. Proof of rabies vaccination is required for all first time applications and renewals.

Annual - unaltered: \$40.00
Lifetime - altered: \$40.00
Lifetime - unaltered: \$60.00



NEW HEBER CITY WEBSITE

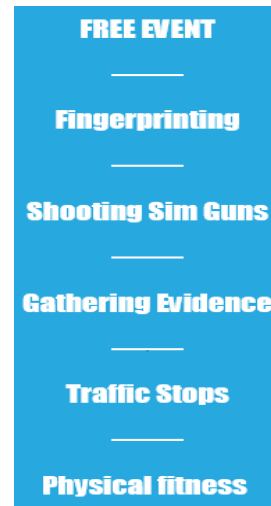
Heber City announces the launch of their new website at www.ci.heber.ut.us. The new website will make it easier to access services, find information, and engage with local government. Enhancements were made to allow for responsive navigation via your mobile devices. The new website also has a website personalization feature which allows you to choose modules and features you'd like to see more often such as calendars or news and announcements. You can also subscribe to notifications for the information you want to hear about, access the site map, and use a translator. There are new links to file for permits and applications online, and to pay your bills online.
