#### **SNOW REMOVAL**

With winter upon us, Heber City would like to remind property owners it is your responsibility to keep all sidewalks adjacent to your property clear of snow and ice accumulation.

Also, beginning November 15<sup>th</sup> of each year and ending April 1<sup>st</sup>, it is unlawful to park or leave parked any vehicle upon the City's paved portion of the street, or within five feet thereof following an accumulation of two inches or more of snow, or any time that snow removal is taking place.
