WORK MEETING

The Council of Heber City, Wasatch County, Utah, met in **Work Meeting** on 04/01/2010 in the City Council Chambers in Heber City, Utah.

Wasatch Irrigation Meeting – May 1st at 10:00 a.m. at the City Offices: Mayor Phillips reminded the Council of this meeting. Anderson said he suspected the Council would be getting phone calls in regard to the scheduled meeting. He said he would, at the next Council meeting, bring forward a proposed agreement between the City and those current Councilmembers having the water shares transferred to them. Anderson said legal counsel assured him this was water stock and not a water right. (The Irrigation Company reserves the water right) The hope was to get this resolved before the May 1st meeting.

Utah City Manager Association Meeting – April 5-7 – St. George: It was indicated Mark Anderson would be going to this convention and would be out of the office Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.

UDOT Annual Visit to Wasatch County – April 15 – 1:00 p.m. – County Council Chambers: Mayor Phillips reminded the Council of this annual meeting and encouraged participation.

Discuss Date for Future Budget Meeting – Suggested April 15 – 4:00 p.m. Discussion about different dates for a meeting. It was indicated the tentative budget had to be ready by the first

meeting in May. It was decided the next Budget Meeting would be held on Saturday, April 17, starting at 8:00 a.m.

Discussion Regarding the Veterans Memorial: It was indicated that Ralph Lugton had approached Mayor Phillips again about moving forward with the Veterans Memorial. Mayor Phillips suggested, with the Council's advice, he would like to put this on hold. Councilman Mergist said he remembered as a child growing up the big money thermometers that were displayed in relation to different causes which showed the amount of monies raised so far on a particular project/cause. He wanted to see the Council allow Lugton to do something like that and display it in the park. Mayor Phillips suggested the Council needed to sit down with Lugton to determine what direction to go. He felt that after the budget was complete was the time to move forward with this.

Bart Mumford – Update on FEMA Flood Map Changes in Heber City: Mumford indicated he wanted to give Council a heads up that he would be bringing forward an ordinance in relation to the FEMA Flood Plan. He said the City was a member of FEMA and they (FEMA) had been updating their map the last few years. This new map showed new areas in the City affected by their update.

Mumford said his Department would be sending out letters to notify people that their property was affected by and included in the new Plan. He said there would be a public meeting on the ordinance as well as comment about the additional properties and why they were included. He continued there was not much to be done once FEMA had identified a property to be included on their maps. Mumford said the public hearing gave people the chance to get insurance at a cheaper rate prior to the new maps going into effect the first of the year. He said there were about 90 people that would be affected by this update and he would be working to notify them about the meeting and the insurance issue.

As there was no other business, the Work Meeting of the Heber City Council held on April 1, 2010, was adjourned.
