NOTICE OF MUNICIPAL ELECTION

Notice of Municipal offices to be voted on in the Heber City Municipal General Election to be held November 3, 2015: 3 City Council Members - 4 year term each.

Candidate filing period is June 1, 2015 through June 8, 2015. Declaration of Candidacy forms or Nomination Petitions must be filed in person with



the City Recorder at 75 North Main, Heber City, Utah, during the normal business hours of 7:30 a.m. - 6:00 p.m.

In accordance with Heber City Code, individuals filing as candidates for the Heber City Council shall pay a \$50.00 fee at the time of filing their candidacy with the City Recorder. This filing fee shall be refundable only if it is determined that the person filing is not qualified to be a candidate, or who is found to have improperly filed. (Ord. 2003-25, 2003)

VOTE BY MAIL IN HEBER CITY

The Heber City Council recently passed Resolution 2015-03, whereby the 2015 Primary and General Municipal Elections will be administered through mail. Studies have found that this method results in increased voter participation, it allows more time for voters to prepare their ballots, and fewer poll workers are needed, thereby reducing the need for training and support. For those who prefer to vote in person, Heber City will still staff an Election Day Vote Center at the Heber City offices on August 11, 2015, if a primary election is needed, and on November 3, 2015.
