CONSTRUCTION UPDATE



First of all, we understand that the City has had an inordinate amount of construction this year. We are appreciative of the patience that has been exercised by our residents. Below is an update on City construction projects:

Roads: Construction is progressing on the 600 South and 1200 East road widening. The roadways should be paved around the middle to end of September with some minor cleanup work remaining. For weekly updates on these projects, send an email to Heber2016@gmail.com and indicate which roadway project you want information on. Just indicate 600 South and/or 1200 East.

Sidewalk will be installed on Industrial Parkway from 1000 South to 910 South during the month of September to create a safer walking route for school children.

Crack Sealing will commence on Lake Creek road once we see cooler temperatures.

Water: Replacement of four blocks of waterline on 500 South is complete with minor cleanup items remaining. Replacement of the 1 ½ blocks of waterline on Main Street from 400 South to 550 South is underway and should be complete before the end of September. Installation of a pressure reducing valve (PRV) and vault on Valley Hills Drive just west of the Wasatch Canal will commence in September.

To help fund these projects, the City has received \$2,000,000 in Federal Small Urban Road Grants for the 600 South and 1200 East road projects and \$150,000 Community Development Block Grant to replace the waterline on 500 South.

CERT TRAINING FALL 2016

The Community Emergency Response team (CERT) program educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and train them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization and disaster medical operations.



Using the training learned in the classroom and during CERT exercises, members can assist their community or workplace following an emergency event when professional responders are not immediately available to help.

Classroom instruction is held on Thursdays in Heber at the Heber City Police Department, but if you miss a class, they are also offered in Orem on Tuesdays and in Provo on Wednesdays from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m..
