SAFETY TIPS: Help protect trick-or-treaters by following these driving safety tips on Halloween, or on the night your community hosts Halloween activities. Be especially careful between 4 and 8 p.m., when most severe vehicle/young pedestrian collisions happen.

Drive slowly, and don't pass stopped vehicles. The driver might be dropping off children. Watch for children darting into the street. Kids can cross the street anywhere, and most young pedestrian deaths happen at spots other than intersections. Children might not stop, either because they don't see your vehicle approaching or don't know how to safely cross the street. Teach them how to safely cross streets. They should look both ways and cross only at corners and crosswalks. Most of the children are wearing some sort of mask and it's difficult for them to see.
