Per Section 10.6.135 of the Utah State Code, notice is hereby given that the Heber City Council will hold a public hearing on Thursday, July 21 at 6:00 p.m. to discuss unbilled services provided by the Water, Sewer and Utility Enterprise Funds to the Heber City General Fund. The estimated value of the services the General Fund receives is as follows: Water \$31,600, Sewer \$2,350 and Utility \$2000. Interested citizens are invited to attend the hearing and express support or opposition to the proposed practice.
