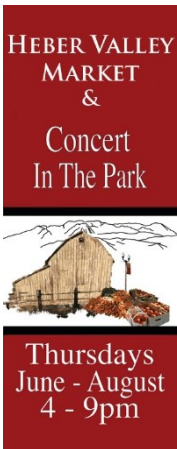

INCREASE IN SEWER RATES

The recently adopted 2017-2018 Operating Budget included a rate increase in Sewer rates. This increase went into effect on the August 1st utility billing. The Sewer base rate will increase from \$16.44 per month to \$17.46 per month, and the flowage charge will increase from \$1.18 to \$1.24 per thousand gallons. This rate increase is necessary to deal with increased operational costs and an aging infrastructure.

CERT TRAINING CLASS

The Heber City Police Department in cooperation with Wasatch County Emergency Management, and the Wasatch County Citizen Corps Council will be hosting a Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training class starting in September 2017. CERT training provides knowledge of what to do in an emergency or disaster to help yourself and others in your neighborhood, including topics such as light fire suppression, first aid, light search and rescue and many other topics.

- Class series starts September 7th 2017, and runs each Thursday evening for eight weeks through October 26th 2017, with a training drill on Saturday October 14th 2017.

PARKING

We have had a few complaints regarding vehicles parked against the flow of traffic on the roadway. It is a legitimate complaint. It is very dangerous to drive in the wrong lane, against the flow of traffic! In addition, it is a violation of Utah State Code and you can be issued a citation for parking against the flow of traffic.

Code Enforcement Officers are doing their best to enforce all parking violations. Please be aware of *all* City and State parking ordinances. If you have any questions regarding parking ordinances, please call the Heber City Police Department 435-654-3040.

41-6a-1402. Stopping or parking on roadways -- Angle parking -- Traffic-control devices prohibiting or restricting.

- (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a vehicle stopped or parked on a two-way roadway shall be stopped or parked with the right-hand wheels:
 - (a) parallel to and within 12 inches of the right-hand curb; or
 - (b) as close as practicable to the right edge of the right-hand shoulder.
