HEBER VALLEY PARKWAY STUDY and Main Street Corridor Planning Study

The Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) and Heber City are completing planning studies for the Main Street Corridor and the future Heber Valley Parkway. These studies have identified a recommended alternate corridor to U.S. 40 and created a unified vision and goal for Heber City's Main Street.
