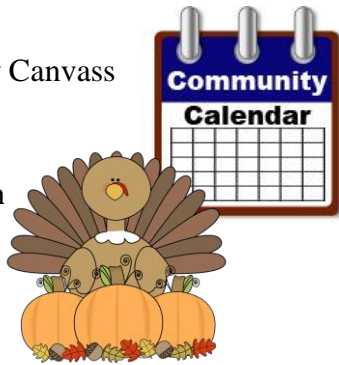

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Heber City is one of the fastest-growing communities in the country. It's a testament to our excellent quality of life, beautiful surroundings and dynamic economy.

But growth pressure in our valley does require us to plan for the future. The population boom has meant more cars and traffic congestion. As a result, we're seeing our air quality deteriorate, particularly during winter inversions.

More and more, I'm hearing from community members who are concerned about the health risks and impact on our valley's tourism appeal. The time to act is now, not when our air quality is much worse. That's why we formed a county-wide advisory committee to discuss what elected officials can do to address the problem.

People often ask me, "How can I help clean up our air?" One idea is to get educated on proposals that would put the whole country — not just Heber City — on a clean energy path.

Sen. Romney has shown real leadership on this front.

He recently floated a proposal that would charge fossil fuel companies for their carbon emissions and return all the money to the American people in quarterly checks. Known as "carbon dividends," this plan would cut harmful carbon emissions in half, and a family of four would receive about \$2,000 per year.

What I like about this solution is that it would encourage clean tech innovation. Ultimately, that's what we need to keep Heber City — and all of America — healthy and beautiful.

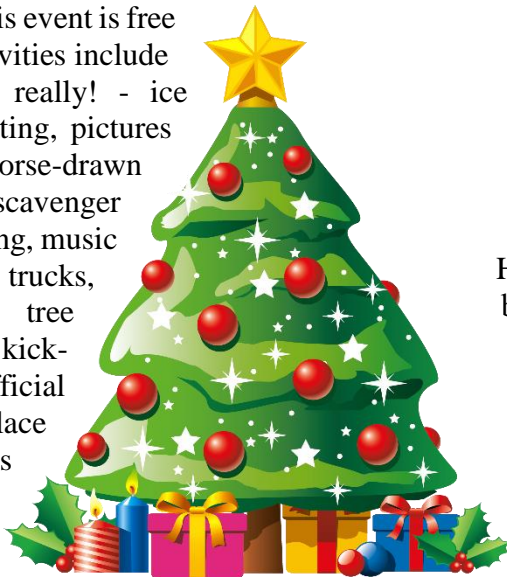
In Person Voting Locations and Hours

IRRIGATION DITCH MAINTENANCE

The City would like to encourage homeowners with irrigation ditches running in front of their homes, to check and clean any debris and weeds that may have accumulated there during the fall. Now that the irrigation season is over, a little preventative maintenance will ensure that winter drainage can flow safely past their properties.

SNOW REMOVAL AND STREET PARKING

It's November and the snow is coming; with that, comes sidewalk and street snow removal.

The Heber City Police Department Code Enforcement would like to remind you that it is your responsibility to shovel any sidewalks that are connected to your property. Failure to do so puts you at risk of a lawsuit for any damage or injury resulting from the build-up of snow and ice on the sidewalks or causing pedestrians to walk in the roadway.

This also serves as a reminder to keep a three-foot radius around your fire hydrant clear from excess snow build up.

Starting November 15th, Heber City Municipal Code 10.16.040, Parking During Snow Clean Up Periods goes into effect. As per code, it is unlawful to park or leave parked any vehicle upon the City's paved portion of the street or within five feet thereof under the following circumstances:

1. When there is any amount of snow on the street;
2. When it is actually snowing or within twenty-four hours thereafter; or
3. The street has not been plowed since the snow fell.
