SNOW REMOVAL AND STREET PARKING

Our snowplowing crew would like to remind Heber City residents that the snow season is upon us and to please keep roadways clear of automobiles, trailers, motor homes, basketball standards, and other roadblocks and debris that may impede snow removal operations.

City code 10.16.040: Parking During Snow Cleanup Periods; parking on the street between November 15th – April 1st may result in a parking ticket and/or towing.

In order to ensure the safety of the community, we need to work together to keep streets as free as possible from snow and ice. Cars and other items along the side of the road cause obstructions to plows and impede our ability to fully remove snow and ice in the area, thus causing potential hazards to pedestrians and drivers.

Additionally, we remind residents that it is a violation of City code to push or pile snow into or across street right-of-ways when removing snow from their own lots (refer to City code 12.06.040: Sidewalk Cleaning Enforcement). We appreciate the public's cooperation in helping to keep our roads safe & clear of snow!
