

#### THE HEBER CITY JUSTICE COURT

Did you know that the Heber City Justice Court is open to handle tickets (may be done in writing), answer the questions, accept fine payments, and otherwise handle much of the Court's day to day business? By Court order, bail can be posted and forfeited on most tickets without the need to appear at a hearing. If you previously failed to appear to handle a ticket, or are otherwise concerned about the status of your matter, please contact the Court to see how best handle your matter. Most matters are being scheduled for and can be resolved by telephone conference with the Judge. If you just need to make a payment, that can be done online at <a href="heberut.gov">heberut.gov</a>.

The office hours during this pandemic's "stay at home order" have been modified, but there is still a clerk in the office from 7:30 am – 12:00 pm, and available by telephone or email from 12:00 pm – 5:00 pm.
