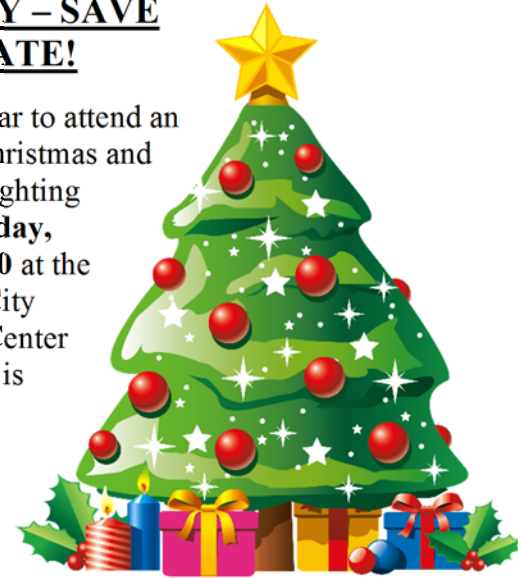
We are seeking applicants for two vacancies on the Heber City Planning Commission as well as two vacancies for alternate Planning Commissioners. The Planning Commission makes recommendations to the City Council regarding land use issues such as the City General Plan, Zoning, and Subdivisions, and decisions on Commercial and Industrial developments and Conditional Uses.

The Commission consists of seven voting members plus two alternates and meets at the City Administrative Offices on the second and fourth Tuesdays of every month at 6 p.m. The term of office for a Planning Commission member is six years; alternates serve two-year terms. Members must be residents of Heber City. See the Heber City website for information and instructions to apply.

City Council is also seeking input for some important decisions that are upcoming. City Council is considering adopting ranked choice voting for city elections. More information is available on the city website and council will be considering it on December 1<sup>st</sup>. Council is also working hard to design and adopt the NVOZ (North Village Overlay Zone). This zone will prescribe development in the areas north of Heber City which are seeking annexation. -- **Mayor Keller Potter**

## PREPARING FOR SNOWPLOWING SEASON: TREE TRIMMING

With the winter season rapidly approaching, Public Works is preparing for snowplowing operations to begin. We ask residents to please trim any tree limbs extending beyond the curb and gutter as soon as possible in order to ensure snowplows can adequately remove snow and to avoid damages to the City's snow removal equipment. Any tree limbs extending beyond the curb and gutter which residents fail to remove will be trimmed by Public Works. Thank you for your cooperation.



## SNOW REMOVAL AND STREET PARKING

It's November and the snow is coming; with that, comes sidewalk and street snow removal.

The Heber City Police Department Code Enforcement would like to remind you that it is your responsibility to shovel any sidewalks that are connected to your property. Failure to do so puts you at risk of a lawsuit for any damage or injury resulting from the build-up of snow and ice on the sidewalks or causing pedestrians to walk in the roadway.

This also serves as a reminder to keep a three-foot radius around your fire hydrant clear from excess snow build up.

Heber City Municipal Code 10.16.040, Parking During Snow Clean Up Periods is in effect. As per code, it is unlawful to park or leave parked any vehicle upon the City's paved portion of the street or within five feet thereof under the following circumstances:

1. When there is any amount of snow on the street;
2. When it is actually snowing or within twenty-four hours thereafter; or
3. The street has not been plowed since the snow fell.
