## INCREASE IN CULINARY WATER, SEWER, SECONDARY IRRIGATION AND STORM DRAIN RATES



Recently City Council adopted a Consolidated Fee Schedule which included a rate increase in Culinary Water, Sewer, Secondary Irrigation and Storm Drain Rates.

The rate increase went into effect for the February Billing period. The Culinary Water base rate increased from \$21.32 to \$22.39, the Sewer base rate increased from \$18.85 to \$21.11 and the Storm Drain fee increased from \$7.33 to \$8.80. Secondary Irrigation rates increased from \$8.16 to \$8.45; \$13.60 to \$14.08; \$20.39 to \$21.10; \$27.19 to \$28.14; and \$33.99 to \$35.18, depending on the lot size. This list is a summary of the most common billing rates, please see the Consolidated Fee Schedule on our website for a full listing of all the rate changes.

This rate increase is necessary to deal with increased operational costs and to replace an aging infrastructure. You may notice an additional note on your bill regarding the HVSSD (sewer treatment plant) cost. This is not an additional charge; we are simply clarifying the fees included in our base rates.

## IT'S NOT TIME TO WATER LAWNS JUST YET

Spring is approaching, which means the return of warmer weather! Of course, here in Utah, we know that spring can easily turn back into winter overnight. So if you are getting "Spring Fever" and looking forward to green lawns and a fruitful garden, remember that grass is typically dormant in our cool mountain valley until mid-April or later.

Fun Fact: While your lawn may look brown and dead, it is actually just resting a bit until consistently warm temperatures are here. Given that grass is currently dormant and will remain so for a few more weeks, don't be tempted to water too soon. In fact, the longer you wait to water your lawn, the stronger your grass roots will become.



We expect irrigation season to begin around mid-April to early May. Until then, keep in mind that 80% is the minimum snow pack to be considered non-drought conditions. ## CEMETERY CLEAN UP NOTICE

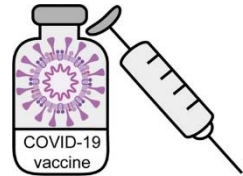

## TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF COYOTE LANE

Coyote Lane will be temporarily closed to public access from March through June 2021, due to improvements and reconstruction of the new Coyote Lane. The suggested alternative route for Coyote Lane is 5<sup>th</sup> North off Main Street, 550 East, and Valley Hills Blvd. Please plan alternate routes for a period of 90 to 120 days after the closure. The Coyote Lane trailhead will also be closed for a portion of the Spring/Summer. During this time pedestrians and cyclists are asked to utilize the Utah Valley University (UVU) trail head.
