

In light of the current drought situation across the State of Utah, the State of Emergency issued by Governor Cox, and the Wasatch County Fire District's Fire Restrictions enacted, Heber City Council has determined to prohibit all fireworks and open-fires for the duration of the summer season, 2021 within the City limits and in line with County restrictions. COYOTE LANE CLOSURE

Construction of the Coyote Ridge Subdivision and realignment of Coyote Lane is continuing through the summer months of 2021. Coyote Lane was originally anticipated to be reopened by the end of June 2021, however the schedule has been delayed a month to resolve permitting issues with the road connection to US40. These have now been resolved and it is anticipated that Coyote Lane will reopen by the end of July 2021. Please continue to use alternate routes during the closure. We again apologize for any hardship this may be causing.



WE NEED YOUR HELP TO CONSERVE HEBER CITY'S WATER!

As you may know, the entire state of Utah is currently in a severe drought, due to lack of snowpack from last winter season. While we have experienced several droughts over the years, we have been notified by Central Utah Water Project, that circumstances this year have recently become even more serious.

In light of this situation, we ask for all residents to assist in participating in Utah's "Slow the Flow – Save H2O" initiative by making every reasonable effort to conserve water. Below are a few ways in which each individual may help Heber City in conserving our vital water resources during this drought:

- Schedule your sprinklers to water your lawn only twice per week, at most
- Water lawns only during cooler, evening hours when water is less likely to evaporate
- Adjust the blade on your lawn mower to allow for slightly longer grass, which helps your lawn retain water at the roots & helps the grass remain greener longer
- Do not allow your faucet to constantly run while brushing your teeth, rinsing dishes, cleaning your kitchen/bathroom, etc.
- Take short showers, instead of baths, whenever possible
- Arrange for leaky faucets, toilets, water heaters, etc. to be repaired – even small drips & leak can greatly increase water usage!
- Contact Heber City Public Works to conduct a water leak check if you suspect you may have a leak

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

With the beautiful weather comes more pedestrians, whether it be families out on a walk or bike rides or those out exercising we see a huge increase in pedestrians. Please be vigilant when driving out and about watch and be aware of pedestrians and children playing. Below are some safety tips from NHTSA.

1. Look out for pedestrians everywhere, at all times. Safety is a shared responsibility.
2. Use extra caution when driving in hard-to-see conditions, such as nighttime or bad weather.
3. Slow down and be prepared to stop when turning or otherwise entering a crosswalk.
4. Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks and stop well back from the cross-walk to give other vehicles an opportunity to see the crossing pedestrians so they can stop too.
5. Never pass vehicles stopped at a crosswalk. There may be people crossing that you can't see.
6. Never drive under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs.
7. Follow the speed limit, especially around people on the street.
8. Follow slower speed limits in school zones and in neighborhoods where children are present.
9. Be extra cautious when backing up—pedestrians can move into your path.
