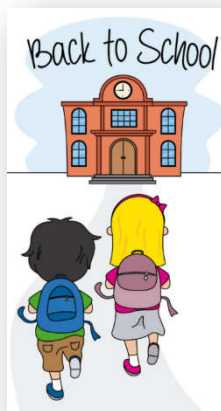

PLEASE KEEP SIDEWALKS CLEAR FOR CHILDREN TRAVELING TO & FROM SCHOOL

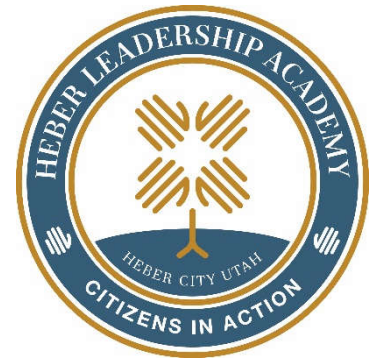

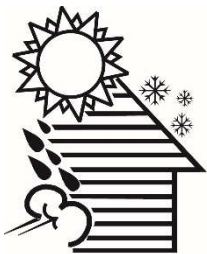

COYOTE LANE CLOSURE UPDATE

Construction of the Coyote Ridge Subdivision and the realignment of Coyote Lane continues. Additional time has been needed to reschedule the concrete and asphalt subcontractors who will finish the improvements to reopen Coyote Lane after permitting issues delayed its connection to US40. Pending weather or other unforeseen circumstances, Coyote Lane is now planned to open on August 20th. Weatherization Works

The Weatherization Program has been designed as an energy saving opportunity for low income households. Its primary purpose is to lower your heating and cooling costs at **NO** cost to you!

Some of the services provided by the Weatherization Program include:

- Energy Audits
- Home Performance Windows/doors
- Furnace testing, repair and replacement
- Attic, wall and floor insulation
- Refrigerator replacement
- Duct sealing and testing
- Blower door testing
- Install ventilation fans
- Water Heater Testing, repair and replacement

The HEAT Program is now open year-around, and provides annual utility assistance to eligible households by making a payment to your Electric and Gas providers.

ELECTIONS

In accordance with UCA 10-3-301, notice is hereby given that the following elected City positions are to be voted upon in the Heber City 2021 Municipal Election: Mayor and two Council Members (2 Seats Available). Any eligible resident wishing to become a candidate for any of the listed offices must file a Declaration of Candidacy form with the City Recorder during the candidate filing period, August 10-17, 2021. The City Recorder office is located at 75 North Main Street, Heber City, UT 84032. The office of the Recorder will be open Monday through Friday between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. for the purpose of Candidate Declaration. SURVIVE THE DROUGHT

The best time to hydrate your trees is in the morning. This is the time that water is most easily absorbed into the soil. Watering should be done once or twice a week, allowing saturation of the upper 12 inches of soil.



To water deeply, set your sprinkler beneath the tree directly away from the trunk concentrating on the areas directly beneath the foliage known as the “drip zone.” This allows for the soil to absorb the moisture it needs.

Trees should be watered as slowly as possible. To gauge the correct amount of watering time, place an empty can of soup in the drip zone. The tree will be sufficiently watered when two inches of water have filled the can.

Wondering if your tree is getting enough water?

The answer is in the soil. To test your soil, poke a long screwdriver into the dirt—if it’s hard to push in, the water may not be reaching the roots.
